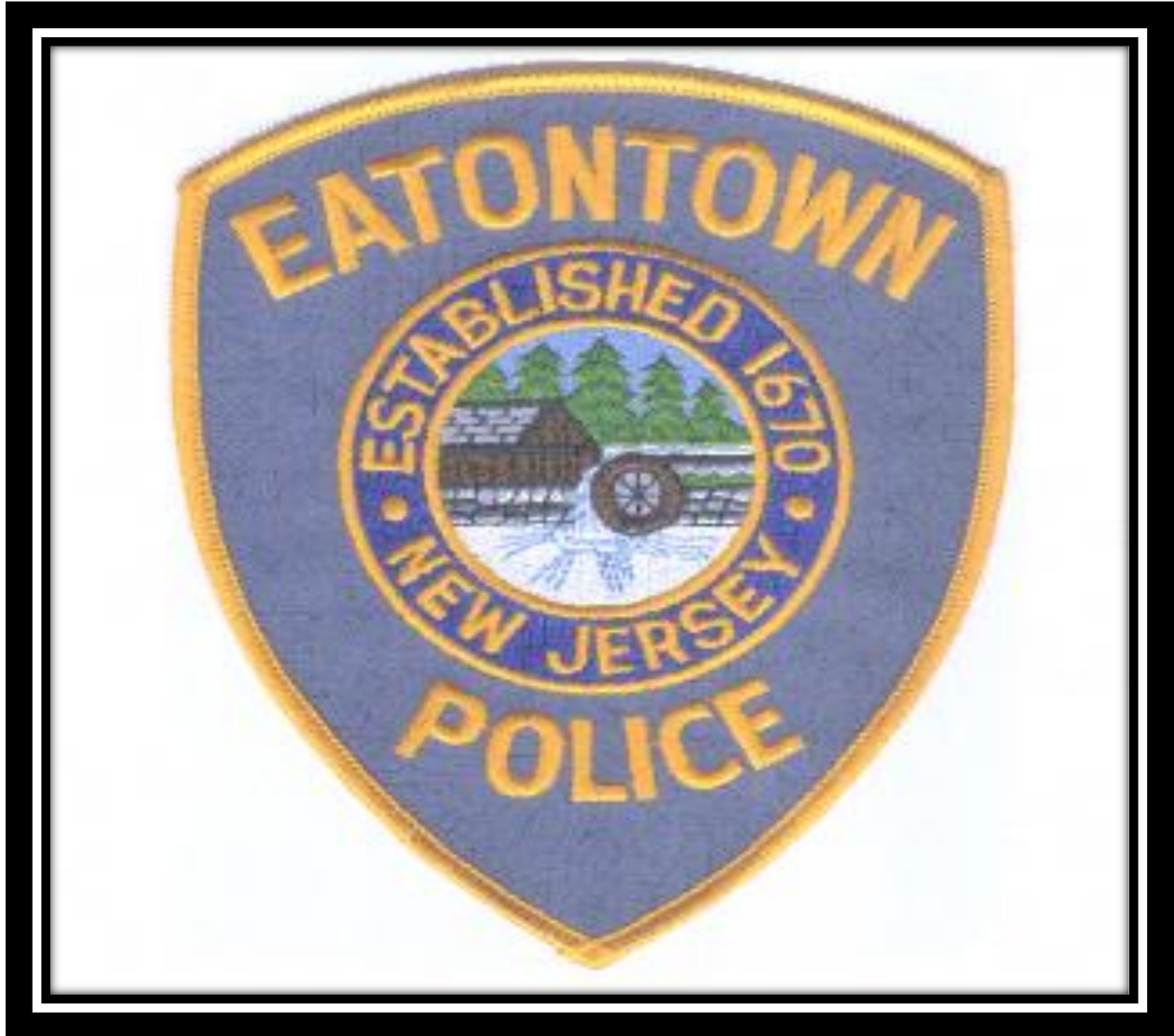


# Annual Report 2017



***It is the mission of the EatonTown Police Department to safeguard the lives and property of the people we serve, to reduce the fear and incidence of crime, and to enhance public safety while working in partnership with the community. Our mandate is to maintain public confidence by serving with honor and integrity.***

The Eatontown Police Department is comparable to the best police departments in the nation, exceeding the standards set by the accrediting agencies including CALEA and NJSACOP. To become a police officer in the Eatontown Police Department, applicants are required to have a Bachelor's Degree, while to get promoted to the captain and chief's positions, a Master's Degree is mandatory. All police officers hired in the last twenty plus years have had previous police experience, some as full-time police officers and others as special officers. Our police officers continue to raise the bar themselves by taking advantage of college incentives and furthering their formal education. One-third of our officers have completed a Master's Degree Program and another one-third are pursuing a Master's Degree. Our officers are continually selected to attend the most prestigious schools in modern policing, including but not limited to: the FBI National Academy, Northwestern University's - School of Police Staff and Command, Rutgers University's - Certified Public Manager Program, the Chiefs of Police Command & Leadership School formerly known as West Point Command & Leadership. Most of our officers have chosen to pursue advanced degrees in administrative studies and our variety of undergraduate degrees makes us incredibly diversified. It gives us the ability to view and resolve problems from different approaches. Undergraduate studies include, criminal justice, political science, public management, oceanography, history, advertisement, mathematics, business, psychology, human services, accounting, education, and sociology.



Under the leadership of Chief Lucia, following the retirement of Chief Goldfarb, the police department made a seamless transition. Morale is high, proactive police duties are on the rise, including traffic enforcement and the checking of suspicious activity. Employee grievances are nonexistent and there is an attitude of mutual respect between our supervisors and personnel. Complaints against our officers are on track to reach an all-time low. Our detectives have investigated several serious crimes including a homicide, home invasion, armed robbery, sexual assaults and aggravated assaults. They have successfully solved most cases and are still pursuing leads in others.

As law enforcement officers we have to prepare for the worst. We have been working diligently with the Office of Emergency Management, surrounding towns and the Department of Homeland Security to create the best response plans. The police department now has emergency response plans for several businesses in our industrial park, the Monmouth Mall and our schools.

Ptl. Christopher Bartlett has continued to work with the Department of Public Works, the OEM and the NJDOT to provide a secondary source of power to our traffic lights at all major intersections. This secondary source of power is essential to creating an atmosphere of calm during storms; it will allow people to travel in routes they are familiar with in order to reduce the disruptions associated with major power outages.



## Internal Affairs Unit

In order for the Eatontown Police Department to maintain public confidence we operate with transparency, reporting quarterly to the Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office and through them to the NJ Attorney General's Office on all matters involving Internal Affairs complaints. Our Internal Affairs files are ready for inspection by the State Attorney General or the Monmouth County Prosecutor at all times. The Eatontown Police Department and our officers are committed to providing law enforcement services that are fair, effective and impartially applied. Eatontown Police Officers hold each other to the highest standard of conduct and are expected to respect the rights of all citizens. We accept complaints from anyone 24 hours a day and each complaint is seriously reviewed in accordance with the Attorney General's Guidelines:

Our police officers responded to 20,207 calls for service in addition to the countless interactions our officers have with the public during routine duties. Those actions led to 4 Internal Affairs Complaints, of those complaints two were a sustained, one was a exonerated, and one was unfounded. Citizens may be misled by the media to believe that police misconduct is on the rise but our numbers speak for themselves. The dashboard cameras in our police cars continue to be a valuable tool when investigating complaints. In the near future, we can expect police officers themselves to be outfitted with body worn cameras. The vast majority of officers will welcome the technology, as it will give them relief from the fear of unwarranted accusations. We hold our officers accountable for their actions and need the public's help in order to do so and therefore encourage the public to report misconduct. I am confident when saying that police officers want to work with others that hold themselves to the highest standards of honor and integrity. When a police officer abuses his power, the Internal Affairs Unit will act swiftly. The place where traffic summonses and complaints are handled is in the court system not the Internal Affairs Unit. Too often people file complaints against officers hoping it will help them in court. Complaints involving traffic summonses and municipal court offenses are immediately investigated and often held open until the court case is completed as the testimony under oath can become part of the case.

It is the policy of this department that officers conducting Internal Affairs Investigations be trained by the NJ Attorney General's Office prior to investigating any complaint of misconduct. The investigator of any complaint will conduct a thorough and objective investigation. Those investigations are reviewed by the Captain and forwarded to the Chief of Police for final approval and disposition.

## Detective Bureau

The Eatontown Police Department Investigations Division consists of 5 full time detectives, one investigator, and one civilian employee. All of the members of the division take their responsibilities very seriously and are committed to the idea of conducting full and comprehensive investigations of each and every crime which is reported to this agency. All of the officers in the division have made this commitment to the citizens of Eatontown, as well as to the many visitors to our community, because they know and understand the importance of public service. They believe that the citizens whom they serve deserve no less than the best we have to offer.

In order to fulfill this commitment, each incident report which we receive in the investigations division is reviewed by a division supervisor, who is well versed in the area of criminal investigations follow-up. The review is used to determine the proper course of investigative action needed, including all aspects of the case to ensure that all options will be explored and all investigative techniques will be exhausted. After this initial review, each case is assigned to a detective for follow-up. Throughout the course of the investigation the detective's actions are monitored by the division supervisor and at the conclusion of the investigation the supervisor reviews the case yet again to ensure the quality of the investigation and make sure that the case was concluded appropriately.

In 2017, personnel assigned to the investigations division initiated 678 calls for service. Through their follow-up investigations, as well as officer initiated calls for service, the investigations division personnel were responsible for 107 arrests of offenders.

## Juvenile Bureau

During the year 2017, the Eatontown Police Department responded to numerous calls for service requiring officers to interact with juveniles in the performance of their duties. In 71 of those interactions, a juvenile was arrested and taken into custody. Several of these juveniles received multiple charges as is reflected below. The number of juveniles arrested in 2017 (71) is a 24% decrease from 2016 when there were (94) juveniles arrested.

## Traffic Safety Bureau

The traffic safety officer is responsible for many administrative and statistical gathering duties. In 2017, one thousand and thirty-seven (1,037) crash reports were reviewed and approved by the Traffic Safety Bureau. It is a daily responsibility to review crash reports and approve them so they may be distributed to the appropriate parties that were involved in these crashes. Once approved, these crash reports are also forwarded to the appropriate state agency for statistical data analysis. The Traffic Safety Bureau also assists patrol officers in conducting follow-up investigations for certain motor vehicle crashes, taking statements from involved parties and witnesses.

The traffic safety officer is assigned to represent the police department as a member of the Traffic Advisory Committee. The committee has the responsibility to address various traffic issues within the borough. This is an important role for the Traffic Safety Bureau because we need the members of the community to voice their concerns to help keep our community a safe place for all.

## Community Services

The goal of the Community Services Officer of the Eatontown Police Department is to deliver superior service to the citizens of Eatontown by working in partnership with members of the community.

The Community Services Unit maintains an active role in the Eatontown Public Schools. The Community Services Officer visits each of the Public Schools on a routine basis to assist with any potential problems as well as to forward information to the schools. The Community Services Officer was the coordinator and instructor of the L.E.A.D. Program. In 2017, this program was taught to each of the sixth grade classes in all three of the borough's elementary schools. This program is designed to familiarize the students with current issues they face relating to drug and alcohol use. At the end of the program, a graduation ceremony and barbeque is held at each of the elementary schools.



Proper child car seat installation is very important in ensuring the safety of child passengers in motor vehicles. The Community Services Officer is a Certified Child Passenger Car Seat Technician. In 2017, car seat inspections and instruction was given to many parents on the proper use and fit of their child's car seats.

The Community Services Officer utilizes the Kid Print Digital Photo and Fingerprint Identification Card Making System. The Community Services Officer utilized this program at several events throughout 2017. At these events, a digital photo identification card is made for children with their pertinent information that includes the child's photo and fingerprint. The parents or guardians are given these cards to keep with them to assist in the unfortunate event that their child were to go missing. The identification cards would then be turned over to the police to assist in finding the child quickly.

Project ChildSafe is a nationwide program that promotes safe firearms handling and storage practices among all firearm owners through the distribution of safety education messages and free firearm safety kits. The kits include a cable-style gun-locking device and a brochure that discusses safe handling and storage. Since 2003, Project ChildSafe has partnered with local law enforcement agencies to distribute more than 36 million safety kits to gun owners in all 50 states and five U.S. territories. To date, the Eatontown Police Department has assisted with the distribution of over 100 ChildSafe Kits.

The Eatontown Police Department receives many requests for tours of our facility by many different organizations. The Community Services Officer is responsible for conducting the tours of our facility and explaining the tools that are utilized to help serve and protect our citizens.

The Wireless at Work program utilizes used or unwanted cell phones that can be distributed to citizens who do not have a device capable of calling 9-1-1 in an emergency.

On Saturday, October 28, 2017 between 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM, The Eatontown Police Department hosted a medicine take back collection site for all unwanted and expired medicines. Residents were invited to drop off all of their unwanted medication to the Eatontown Police Department for proper disposal

In 2017, the Community Services Officer was assigned to supplement the patrol division with answering calls for service and was assigned to courtroom security detail weekly. The Community Services Officer also assisted the Services Division by filling in for the Records Bureau as needed. During 2017, The Community Services Unit continues to take positive steps in bringing the Borough of Eatontown schools, police and the community together. The various other programs offered have enjoyed continued success and are valued by the community we serve.
